

DAY ONE


Nairobi Hotel 1 night (bed & breakfast)

Most international flights into Nairobi arrive at a time which is not conducive with connecting to scheduled flights straight onto safari.

We will therefore put you up in a Nairobi hotel of our choice so that you can rest and relax before beginning your safari with us.

DAY TWO, THREE, FOUR, FIVE

Ol Pejeta Bush Camp 4 nights (full board)

Ol Pejeta is a traditional bush camp, with six safari tents set along the banks of the Ewaso Nyiro River in the Ol Pejeta Conservancy, with majestic views over Mount Kenya and the Aberdare Mountain Range.

All tents come complete with warm blankets for the chilly mornings, rechargeable solar lights and en-suite bathrooms with hot-water safari bucket

showers and flushing toilets. Individual verandas provide the perfect spot to while away an afternoon in privacy, watching the animals come and go along the river bank. There is a main guest area where meals are served and drinks can be enjoyed overlooking the river in the sitting area,

Alongside the traditional game drives and superb bush walks with Alex Hunter, activities from Ol Pejeta Bush Camp focus on the unique conservation projects in the conservancy. Visits to the Sweetwaters Chimpanzee Sanctuary and the Northern white rhino enclosure are both on offer, with a small supplement, as well as mornings or afternoons spent with the local communities to gain an insight into the daily workings of the conservancy.

However you choose to spend your days on safari here, Ol Pejeta guarantees a wonderfully varied safari experience in this unique corner of Kenya and the chance to make a true difference to the future of conservation. To maximise your time here we recommend a minimum of three or four nights to allow you time to enjoy the conservation activities

alongside more traditional safari activities, but there is more than enough to do here to keep you busy for a week if you have the time.

Includes: All meals, house drinks, laundry and private activities including 4x4 game drives and short walks (minimum age 12 years)

*Please note walks are seasonal and if the grass is too long we won't be able to offer walks. Excludes: non-house drinks; night drives (please note that night drives are always on a shared basis, private night drives are not available),


ABOUT THE AREA: OL PEJETA CONSERVANCY

Ol Pejeta Conservancy contains some of the highest densities of wildlife in Kenya and a wealth of endangered species, including wild dog, Grevy's zebra and the locally threatened Jackson's hartebeest. Significantly,

the region is also home to some of the most pioneering and successful conservation initiatives of recent years, and Ol Pejeta Conservancy is a beacon amongst them. A former cattle ranch, the 400square kilometre conservancy is a splendid example of sustainable and quantifiable conservation benefiting both local communities and wildlife, putting Ol Pejeta Conservancy firmly on the map as one of the most successful conservation initiatives in the world. Since February 2007 the conservancy is the biggest rhino sanctuary in East Africa and is home to 100 black rhino as well as three of the last seven known Northern White Rhinos.















DAY SIX, SEVEN, EIGHT, NINE

Exclusive private mobile camp 4 nights (full board)

Being a mobile safari, we can set up camp anywhere you feel like going. Our most popular destinations are the Masai Mara Game Reserve, Shaba National Reserve, Meru National Park and Samburu National Reserve. These areas combine stunning landscapes with great game viewing opportunities.

Each canvas tent is roomy and private, with a secluded verandah and wonderful views. Each tent has an ensuite bathroom with a short-drop loo and bucket shower, which can be brought at any time of day.

The campsites are all well appointed and exclusive, ensuring delightful views and privacy. Our main mess tent has a well stocked bar and travelling library, and all meals (apart from bush meals) are served in here. The bush kitchen, where all your fabulous three course meals are prepared, is just behind. There is also a central charging area for cameras, phones etc, which runs off an inverter charged by a small generator.

Each day is planned at dinner the night before, or sitting around the camp fire before bed. Every morning usually begins with a hot cup of tea or coffee in bed, before heading out for an early morning game drive when the predators are most active. Some days you'll come back after a couple of hours and some you will take a picnic breakfast out so you can explore wider areas, and then return to camp for a delicious and well-earned lunch and siesta. After a restorative cup of tea, we usually head out again for an afternoon game drive

or go on a walk to stretch the legs. Evening game drives again offer better chances of watching predators in action. Returning for a hot shower before a delectable dinner, nights on safari are blissful. Sitting by the camp fire, listening to the sounds of the wild is the best way to end the day's adventures

ABOUT THE AREA: THE MAASAI MARA

Since the early 1940s, the Maasai mara has been Kenya's ultimate wilderness destination and one of the world's last great wildlife strongholds. today, some seventy years later, the 645 square mile (1,670 square kilometre) mara is still an absolute must on a safari itinerary: it remains one of the only places left on earth where game can still be seen in the super-abundance as a century ago.

Unlike the great Serengeti wilderness, of which the mara forms the much smaller northern extension, the mara's more regular rainfall ensures that this abundance endures all year round- the vast savannah plains are scattered with hers of zebra, giraffe, gazelle eland, elephant and buffalo; the acacia forests about with birdlime and monkeys and the mara and tales rivers are home to hippo and crocodile.

If we are lucky, black rhino can be sighted and this is the only place in Kenya where topi are common. Over 400 species of birds have been recorded with grassland and wetland birds, particularly well represented. Raptors such as the martial eagle and batteleur eagle are common along with large numbers of vultures.

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DAY SIX, SEVEN, EIGHT, NINE

Encounter Mara Camp 4 nights (full board)

Encounter mara is positioned under the shade of acacia trees, blending into the natural environment boasting exceptional views over the open plains. Wildlife is regularly seen in and around camp, with zebra and giraffe often seen grazing in front of the guest tents.

The camp is small, with ten en-suite tents, all with running water and hot bucket safari showers. Views of the open savannah can be enjoyed from the comfort of your own bed, or from the private verandah at the front of each tent.

Meals are served under the stars, or on cooler evenings in the main tent which is beautiful lit up at night. Dinner is a sociable affair with all guests eating together and exchanging stories of their travels and their day's adventures in the bush.

Activities include day and night fame drives, as well as guided walks. For an additional fee, fly camping is also available, and is a fantastic experience to get closer to nature and Geel at one with the natural surroundings, sleeping in dome tents and sharing stories around the camp fire.

Includes: all meals, house drinks, laundry and private activities including 4x4 day & night game drives and short walks (minimum age 12 years)
